xt	KS3	This combined curriculum aims to build knowledge from Year 7 to Year 9. The curriculum aims to equip students with powerful knowledge that will form a solid foundation for further study, yet that will also provide students with knowledge to make meaningful contributions to society. Lessons of Classics and Grammar are planned throughout the KS3 curriculum to develop students' understanding from Year 7 to Year 9 in a sequenced way.
