Welcome to our first HPL Hub newsletter. HPL stands for High Performance Learning. HPL is a philosophy which roots itself in the belief that all students can reach high performance and with practice and perseverance, students will be able to reach their full potential. This philosophy is accompanied by a framework which gives a selection of skills, values, attributes and thinking characteristics which support our students in fulfilling their full potential and reach their ambition. There are two strands in the HPL framework: ACPs (Advanced Cognitive Performance characteristics) and VAAs (Value, Attitude and Attributes). ACPs are about how students think when tackling different learning activities in lessons whilst VAAs are about how students behave towards their learning.

We embed the HPL philosophy throughout our school. We never tell our students they cannot achieve; it is just they are not doing it yet but with practice and perseverance it will happen.





HPL in geography:



Interview with Ms Yates

We went to see Ms Yates to ask her some questions about her feelings about HPL and where her interest in bringing it to the school came from.

Why do you think HPL would help the school?

"We wanted our students to be full of ambition and have high aspirations. The big area we wanted to focus on was the belief that everyone has the potential to become a high performer if they try and deliberately practise".

What's your favourite attribute?

How did you hear about HPL?

"We really connected when we had the founder of HPL – Deborah Eyre give a keynote speech at our joint training day within the KEVI Trust. How do you think HPL has changed how this academy works?

"I think it has made talking about the way you learn easier and will help students in the future to be more independent as we will all know how to approach our learning."

"I would like to see students more confident with learning and encourage our families to be more involved in HPL so that they can talk about the ACPs and VAAs at home too.

How do you think we can implement it more in lessons?

Students being more fluent in remembering the ACPs and VAAs, teachers showing the skills themselves so students get an idea and will start to understand what the VAAs and ACPs are. I'd like to see students talking about the ACPs and selecting the most useful ones to support them with their learning in lessons.

How do you think HPL will develop individual characteristics?
