Give clear facts, make it something engaging that you would want to listen to Events to choose from: 1) The 1905 Revolution 2) Russia in the First World War 1914-17 3) The February Revolution 1971 4) The October Revolution 1917 5) The Russian Civil War 1917 – 1922.


